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

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


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


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
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#### The New "Third Color" - - -







In considering the possibilities of a new style either in pattern or color or construction, we are guided not only by the reports from professional style observers in the trade press but also by the reactions of buyers for the leading style shops in the country.

A good buyer keeps himself well posted on style trends and in that way he knows what is salable.

During the past few months, in waiting on such buyers in our showrooms, we have had almost uniformly the following experience. The buyer would look over our various ranges and invariably be would hold the bluish sets and the reddish sets for further consideration, and would toss away the green sets with the remark that he could not sell that color any more—that it was dead. Naturally, we were very much interested in that buyer's notion as to what color was going to supplant green. "the mysterious third color"—the feature color.

Brown would seem to be the logical follower of green. But brown is not really a good neckwear color. Buyers don't like it because they find it hard to sell. So what we did was to take brown and inject a reddish cast into it—brightened it up. It made a beautiful color. Reddish Brown, Buyers and style observers are very enthusiastic about this color.
