
In selecting a scroll saw, always be particular to get one with a long swing, otherwise you will have to cut your wood into small pieces in order to swing it.

On orders for wood amounting to \$2.00 or over, I will make a discount of 5 per cent.



I can send Black Walnut or Oak in 2, 3, 4 or 6 foot lengths; all other woods are cut in 2 ft. lengths.

I have on hand about 500 feet  $\frac{8}{16}$  Holly that is second grade and will sell it off for 4 cents a foot. It will pay you to order a few feet when sending for other woods, as it will be just the thing to chonize or to back up some dark wood. I offer it at this low price, which is less than half what it cost, to make room for other woods and for the reason that I wish to keep no second-class wood of any kind in stock. I guarantee my wood to be as good and as smoothly planed as any in the world, and all wood will be shown me by my clerks before it is shipped to you, and I shall allow none to leave the store that is not first-class.

### SCROLL SAW BLADES.

HE most important article needed in Scroll Sawing is the blade. If you use a poor, cheap blade, you are liable to spoil the wood, design,—and your temper. I do not recommend any except the "Star" and "Griffin," but keep the best quality German blade for those who wish it. The price is the same on all kinds and if you are unacquainted with the different kinds, I should advise trying some of each. The sizes in all makes run from No. 000 to 10, but you will find Nos. 1, 2 and 3 the best for ordinary sawing. I do not sell less than one dozen blades.
