ANNOUNCEMENT

This catalogue has been prepared for the purpose of facilitating the work of officers charged with the duty of purchasing articles manufactured in the several State prisons as provided by Section 182 of the Prison Law. It contains cuts of the principal articles produced. Attached hereto is the price list showing the cost of each article as fixed by the Board of Classification, provided for by Section 184 of the Prison Law.

State departments and institutions requiring special equipment will be supplied when it is practicable to meet the requirements. Special effort will be made to provide the furniture, furnishings, cloth, clothing, towels, blankets, shoes, tinware, foundry-ware, brooms, brushes, etc., required in the several charitable and penal institutions of the State and its political divisions.

All officers charged with the purchasing of goods manufactured in the State prisons may be assured that no effort will be spared to facilitate compliance with the provisions of the Prison Law, requiring the purchase from the prisons of articles produced in the prisons that may be needed by the departments or institutions under their charge.

It is important that requisitions for school or cabinet furniture be made as far in advance as possible so that requirements as to special design or finish may be complied with.

Officers desiring to be released from purchasing articles produced in the prisons should address the State Commission of Prisons, Albany, N. Y. For information regarding all other matters relating to the subject, address Superintendent of State Prisons, Albany, N. Y.

In Accordance with the Provisions of Chapter 47, Laws of 1909, "An Act relating to prisons, constituting Chapter 43 of the Consolidated Laws"



LAWS RELATING TO THE SALE OF PRISON-MADE GOODS

§ 175. Prisoners employed for use of state, and divisions THEREOF.—All convicts sentenced to state prisions, reformatories and penitentiaries in the state, shall be employed for the state, or a political division thereof, or in productive industries for the benefit of the state, or the political divisions thereof, or for the use of public institutions owned or managed and controlled by the state, or the political divisions thereof, which shall be under rules and regulations for the distribution and diversification thereof, to be established by the state commission of

prisons.

§ 182. Articles manufactured to be furnished to the state or division thereof.-The superintendent of state prisons, and the superintendents of reformatories and penitentiaries, respectively, are authorized and directed to cause to be manufactured by the convicts in the prisons, reformatories and penitentiaries, such articles as are needed and used therein, and also such as required by the state or political divisions thereof, and in the buildings, offices and public institutions owned or managed and controlled by the state, including articles and materials to be used in the erection of the buildings. All such articles manufactured in the state prisons, reformatories and penitentiaries, and not required for use therein, shall be of the styles, patterns, designs and qualities fixed by the board of classification, and may be furnished to the state, or to any political division thereof, or for or to any public institution owned or managed and controlled by the state, or any political division thereof, at and for such prices as shall be fixed and determined as hereinafter provided, upon the requisitions of the proper officials, trustees or managers thereof. No article so manufactured shall be purchased from any other source, for the state or public institutions of the state, or the political divisions thereof, unless said state commission of prisons shall certify that the same can not be furnished upon such requisition, and no claim therefor shall be audited or paid without such certificate.

§ 183. Estimates of articles required to be furnished com-MISSION OF PRISONS BY OFFICERS.—On or before October first in each year, the proper officials of the state, and the political divisions thereof. and of the institutions of the state, or political divisions thereof, shall report to the said commission of prisons estimates for the ensuing year of the amount of supplies of different kinds required to be purchased by them that can be furnished by the penal institutions in the state. The said commission is authorized to make regulations for said reports, to provide for the manner in which requisitions shall be made for supplies, and to provide for the proper diversification of the industries in said

penal institutions.

§ 184. Board of classification; prices to be fixed.—The fiscal supervisor of state charities, the state commission of prisons and the superintendent of state prisons and the lunacy commission are hereby constituted a board to be known as the board of classification. Said board shall fix and determine the prices at which all labor performed, and all articles manufactured in the charitable institutions managed and controlled by the state and in the penal institutions in this state, and furnished to the state or the political divisions thereof, or to the public institutions thereof, shall be furnished, which prices shall be uniform to all, except that the prices for goods or labor furnished by the penitentiaries to or for the county in which they are located, or the political divisions thereof, shall be fixed by the board of supervisors of such counties, except New York and Kings counties, in which the prices shall be fixed by the commissioners of charities and correction, respectively. The prices shall be as near the usual market price for such labor and supplies as possible. The state commission of prisons shall devise and furnish to all such institutions a proper form for such requisition, and the comptroller shall devise and furnish a proper system of accounts to be kept for all such transactions. It shall also be the duty of the board of classification to classify the buildings, offices and institutions owned or managed and controlled by the state, and it shall fix and determine the styles, patterns, designs and qualities of the articles to be manufactured for such buildings, offices and public institutions, in the charitable and penal institutions in this state. So far as practicable, all supplies used in such building, offices and public institutions shall be uniform for each class, and of the styles, patterns, designs and qualities that can be manufactured in the penal institutions in this state.

LOOSE LEAF SHAKING AND DUMPING GRATE

This grate was originally designed to meet the requirements of one of the New York City departments, and is still used by them to considerable extent. It has been improved from time to time, as defects in the original patterns were discovered, until as at present manufactured it will adequately meet every demand made for a shaking and dumping grate. It is economical in coal consumption and requires a minimum amount of attention. It has an advantage over grates of a pattern which have a continuous bar crossing the sections, which, in case of breakage, however small, would have to be wholly replaced at considerable expense, necessitating the closing down of the furnace awaiting repairs. In this grate, the loose leaves obviate all that difficulty, as a few of them may be kept on hand and in event of breakage can be replaced, without drawing the fire, and at very small expense.

The grate consists of right and left side journal bars and a center journal bar, all of which rest on the front and rear bearing bars set in the furnace wall. They are connected at front and rear and held perfectly rigid by tie or end bars, all dovetailed together, thus avoiding the use of bolts or screws. The side journal bars are slotted to receive the rounded lugs on the rocker bars, while the center journal bar has holes correspondingly spaced for seating the opposite end of the rocker bars. The loose leaves sit on the rocker bars.

Usually the grate is made in four sections, though it may be of two, and when the grate is in place all sections may be shaken or dumped at once, or each separately, by means of levers which fit the shaking bracket projecting beyond the furnace front. This lever connects with the shaking rod, one for each section, which passes through a lug cast on the connecting piece. The connecting piece joins the rocker bars of each section together, and when the rod is in place the whole section is moved forward or backward at the will of the attendant, or dumped, as the case may be. When not in use the shaking lever on the front of the boiler is locked, so that no accident of stoking can move any portion of the grate surface.

To insure absolute rigidity of the grate, each one is supplied with an adjustable center rest which is usually set in the concrete of the pit, but may merely rest on the pit floor. The grate can be made in any size and repair parts supplied if needed. The air space is uniform at three-quarters of an inch, which has been found best for the burning of all but the smallest sizes of coal. Bituminous coal is very economically and satisfactorily burned.

FLAT DUMPING GRATE

The flat dumping grate is used very extensively by one of the large departments of New York City. It has been subjected to the most difficult tests and found perfectly capable of answering every requirement made upon it.

The grate is very simple in construction, having few parts, and all of these are very strong so that breakages are very infrequent.

As the name signifies the grate can be dumped, but not shaken. It consists of side, right and left, journal bars, and two center, right and left, journal bars, the ends of all of which are bolted to the front and rear separator or tie bars. The grate bars are of diagonal pattern and rest on the rocker bar which seats in the side and center journal bars. This, in turn, is bolted to a lug, to the end of which is bolted the rear end of the rocker rod which dumps the grate section when manipulated from the front of the furnace, where a bracket, supporting the dumping levers, is securely bolted.

The grate is made in four sections, each identical in construction and operation with the others. The whole rests on legs or standards which are set in the concrete of the ash-pit floor.

Air space is standard in \(\frac{1}{4}\), \(\frac{5}{16}\) and \(\frac{3}{8}\) inches, and repair bars can be furnished from stock in standard grate sizes, namely, 54, 60 and 66 inches depth.






TWENTIETH CENTURY BAG AND CAN CARRIERS

The Twentieth Century Street Cleaning Bag and Can Carriers are made of the best materials throughout; the frame of tubular steel; axle and can support of steel; platform, small wheels and arm supports of malleable iron; all mounted on 30-inch wood wheels of approved pattern. The can support has projecting pins along its under edge, these points acting as catches to hold the bag in position, as shown. Both bags and cans are held in place by a jack chain secured at one end to the can support at one side of the carrier, the free end having an S shaped hook to catch at the opposite side, after the bag or can is in position. The can (No. 2) described on page 203 is recommended for use with the carrier. Both carriers and cans have been adopted by the New York City Department of Street Cleaning.


No. 1. Twentieth Century Carrier, complete except bag or can.


IMPROVED STEEL LEAF SPRING BALANCED DUMPING CARTS

This style of cart is adapted to every branch of the public service for the hauling of garbage, street sweepings, manure, ashes, rubbish, sand, gravel, mortar and coal, and, while used largely by departments for ashes and street sweepings only, is equally available for the use of the smaller departments and of institutions where the requirements are not sufficient to necessitate the operation of special patterns of vehicles for hauling substances of a varied character. For paper and rubbish, for street sweepings, and for liquid garbage, we manufacture different styles of carts and trucks for use where the requirements are such as to warrant their maintenance.


The principle involved in the construction of this pattern of cart is that of a perfect balance of load and an equal distribution of weight under all conditions. The trunnions, upon which the all-steel body is balanced, are housed in bearings secured to the bow of the leaf springs carried at the butts of the shafts. The interposition of these springs between the running-gear and the load takes the dead weight of the latter from the gear and provides the requisite resiliency to the load; the self-leveling of the load is also accomplished, thus insuring the full capacity of the body. The result is a saving upon both the driver and the horse, and a diminution of the wear and tear upon the vehicle.

IMPROVED STEEL LEAF SPRING BALANCED DUMPING CARTS-Continued

The body is made of sheet steel, very strong and durable, yet comparatively light. The lapped, riveted joints are reinforced to insure cleanliness, and to present an anti-friction surface in the discharge of the load. The shape of the body does away with the necessity for a tail-board, with a consequent saving in both time and labor. The incline in the bed begins at the point of balance, so that in unloading the entire contents of the load are emptied without recourse to the use of a shovel or other aid upon the part of the driver.

The details of the running gear represent a careful comparison of the relative values of different sizes of wheels, tires, axles and springs.

Many of the institutions and departments use a canvas cover which we manufacture for this cart (see page 195), which enables the driver to haul a full-topped load without scattering any of it. We also furnish sets of racks for this cart, as shown in the above illustration, by the use of which the cart is made quickly available for hauling paper and rubbish and such household refuse of a bulky nature as enters into the work of all departments.


No. 1. Balanced Dumping Carts, capacity 36 cubic feet, steel body.



IMPROVED STEEL BALANCED SEWAGE DUMPING CARTS

The sewage cart shown above was designed especially for hauling liquid garbage and sewage, the body being closely riveted to a frame made of angle iron, to absolutely prevent leakage, instead of being lapped at the joints as in the construction of the body in the other patterns of steel carts. This pattern should therefore be considered in all conditions where liquid substances constitute a very large percentage of the work of the department.

The principle involved in its construction is the same in all the carts manufactured by this Department, i. e., the accurate balancing of the body, under all conditions of load, over the center of gravity above the axle. The handling of the sewage cart is similar in every way to that of the regular styles.

It will be seen, by reference to the illustrations, that the body of this cart differs from the other styles, in that the front of the body is curved instead of meeting the bottom at right angles. The front and bottom of the body being of one piece, as in all the carts, has been found particularly advantageous in this cart for hauling liquids.

The handling of the sewage cart is similar in every way to that of the regular styles. The light draft of this vehicle is one of its principal features, the capacity having been determined to permit of handling loads of every kind that enter into the work of both institutions and public departments of health and sewers.


Semi-compensation carts are of lighter construction and fewer working parts than the other patterns made by this Department, and better adapted for shorter hauls and lighter loads. For this reason they are very largely used by the institutions and smaller towns throughout the State, and in parks, where dirt and macadamized roads are numerous and vehicles with springs are not as necessary as in a city where hard payements predominate.

These carts are built along lines entirely different from the construction of the other carts, although the principle of a perfect balance of the load above the center of gravity is maintained. The handling of the body in dumping the load and bringing back to the normal position is accomplished with the same ease that characterizes all of these carts as being exceptionally light upon both the driver and the horse.



STEEL BODY SPRING PEDESTAL BALANCED DUMPING TRUCKS

The semi-compensation truck is considered the superior of any type of vehicle intended for the same purposes, but in certain localities there exists a demand for a truck with springs upon both the rear and front axles.


The sleeve pedestals used in the manufacture of the other trucks made by this Department are provided with cushions as described, and in developing the new spring pedestal it has been the endeavor to provide resiliency to the rear portion of the truck without involving the weight that would be necessary were leaf steel springs used.

Reference to the illustration above discloses the construction of the pedestal, with the springs interposed between the two leaves of the pedestal. The direct connection with the rear axle insures the distribution of the weight in such a manner as to impart the required resiliency forward of the rear axle, at the point where the weight of the load is balanced.

The illustrations of this truck show the addition of the side boards used by many of the departments to increase the carrying capacity of the body where the character


of the refuse will admit of larger loads being hauled. These boards come in sets of three, used on the two sides. They are not furnished with the truck unless specially designated, but promptly shipped upon receipt of order giving stock number of truck for which they are intended.

It is unnecessary to again describe the operation of this truck as it is the same as that of the other trucks. Too much stress, however, cannot be laid upon the light-running, easy-handling qualities of the balanced dumping trucks, when the circumstances under which they are operated are considered. It is intended to apply the new spring pedestal construction in the manufacture of the covered sanitary trucks, where, in consequence of the nature of the refuse usually carried by them, the additional resiliency is equally as essential to the successful operation of the truck under varying conditions of load and service.



IMPROVED WOOD BODY PAPER AND RUBBISH CARTS

This cart is intended only for the transportation of paper and light or bulky rubbish of which large loads can be carried, particularly where the racks are used. The body of the cart consists of a heavy oak frame, lined with wood, and sufficiently ironed to withstand the spreading tendency of loads of refuse when settling in transit. The body is hung over a drop-axle and therefore close to the ground to admit of the large capacity indicated without placing the top of the body, with racks, out of reasonable reach.

This cart is not of the dumping pattern, yet it is built along the same principles as the balanced carts, so far as the accurate suspension of the load over the center of gravity

is concerned. This is important in a cart intended for quick handling where the weight of the load has but little relation to the bulk carried.


Where the racks are not used, the Department manufactures a canvas cover (see page 195) for use when the contents of the load are of a character that can be easily blown about by the wind. The illustration of the racks as applied to an open steel cart, shown on page 193, gives a clear idea of the manner in which paper and other refuse may be easily handled.

Improved Nose Feed Bag

The improved nose feed bag, shown on this page, is made of long, clean staple American cotton canvas and contains absolutely no waste or sizing. It is large and roomy enough for the horse to feed from in perfect comfort, being 14 and 16 inches deep, and 17 and 18½ inches wide at the top. The bottom is made of extra quality tan grain leather, sewn in with a double row of stitching, and, to make perfectly secure, is fastened with special galvanized, clinched rivets. Around the bottom and up the back there is a reinforcement of a wide strip of tan grain leather. The nose-piece is of leather, the openings in which are tinned eyelets sufficiently large to allow plenty of air, yet small enough to preclude the possibility of the feed falling or being blown through them.

The russet leather straps, which hold the bag in position, are in two pieces with tinned strap-buckles. By noting the side view of this bag it will be seen that, unlike those with a single fastening on either side, it is impossible for the horse to toss it over his head. The points at which the straps are riveted to the canvas are reinforced with leather.

The regular price quoted includes initialing, the lettering to be of a size and style to suit and done with the best quality of black coach paint. A special stencil is cut for each order, so that at any future date the design may be duplicated.

HORSE BLANKETS



Kersey Lined Canvas Horse [Body] Quarter Blankets

Department horses are subjected to all kinds of weather, their work necessarily continuing through the rain, snow and sleet of winter, and the rains of summer. The heavy nature of this work renders them particularly susceptible to changes of temperature, and nearly all municipal departments recognize this fact by providing protection against the elements, thereby adding to the usefulness of the animal.

The breast cover shown on page 199 is used in connection with the horse blanket illustrated in accompanying engraving, to afford the needed protection. Both the breast cover and blankets are usually worn during inclement weather to conserve the animal heat and add to the health and comfort of the animal.

These blankets are made of serviceable canvas to keep off rain, sleet and snow, and are lined with kersey, or some similar material, to give the necessary warmth and afford protection to the overheated body.

The blankets are shaped to give the necessary fullness required by the back of the horse and are of sufficient dimensions to cover well down on both sides. The thicknesses of canvas and lining are carefully stitched at points where required to keep the blanket in shape. The blankets will be initialed without additional charge.

STREET CANS

The side springs, which admit of these cans being "nested," each can easily separable from the top of the nest, is the most important feature of this style of can.

The shell of the can is made from No. 18, American gauge steel sheets, lock-seamed at the joints, and riveted at top and bottom through the seam. The bottom is of malleable cast iron and is indestructible. There is an iron band about 1½ inches wide riveted around the body at the top, over which the shell is turned. The can is provided with two malleable iron handles, placed near the top band, and securely riveted to the shell.

The side springs have shoulders that engage the top of the next can when set down or "nested" inside of it, preventing the two cans, in such position, from becoming locked or jammed together. This feature admits of the handling or storing of an unlimited number of cans in the same floor or wagon space that would be taken up by a single row of cans not provided with the springs.

The street can is 24 inches high and 15 inches and 19 inches in diameter at the bottom and top, respectively. Department initials will be stenciled as ordered,

GARBAGE CANS

This can is of the same size and construction as the street can last described with the one exception that it does not have the side springs. It is principally intended to supply the demand for an extra heavy garbage and ash can where frequent emptying, or other handling, would be too great a strain upon a lighter built can. A can for service such as this is intended for receives the most of the wear upon the bottom, or rather upon the bottom edge, if the lower periphery of the can may be so designated.

This wear or strain is not so much in the weight that must be borne by the bottom in supporting the contents of the can as in the jar or strain imparted in returning the can to the ground after the contents have been emptied into the wagon.

This can is 24 inches high and 15 inches and 19 inches in diameter at the bottom and top, respectively. Department initials will be stenciled upon the side if request is made at time order is forwarded. This type of can is also available for use with the bag and can carrier where the advantage of the "nesting" is not essential.

STABLE CANS

The stable cans are made of lighter material than those just described and provided with a cover as shown in the accompanying cut. This can, while watertight, is not recommended for use as a garbage can, being intended for use in stables or other places where the refuse is of a lighter and dryer nature. The bottom of this pattern is of sheet iron, securely riveted at a point about one inch above the lower edge of the shell.

These cans are not usually lettered, but the Department will initial them, as desired, where the quantity is sufficient to justify the additional expense. The two handles are placed at a lower point upon the shell than in the other cans described. The height of the stable and refuse can is 24 inches, the diameter at the bottom 15 inches, and at the top 19 inches. The cover is flared to shed rain when the can is placed in an exposed place. This can makes a perfect garbage can, being riveted closely to insure tightness, the lid providing protection against dogs and other pilferers, as well as keeping out the sun and keeping in the odors.

PAPER AND FRUIT SKIN CANS

The paper and fruit skin can is an important item in the street cleaning plans of all cities. It is intended for use along the curbs of the principal business streets and at intersections where, for any reason, the traffic is heavy. As a round can would take up too much of the width of the sidewalk, this can is made in the form of an elipse, 22 inches on the major axis by 18 inches on the minor. This portion of the can is 24 inches high surmounted by a 12-inch hood covering one-half of the opening.

The purpose of this can is to offer a suggestive receptacle for the reception of refuse, such as fruit skins and paper, about to be thrown away by anyone passing on the sidewalk. The hood serves to partially screen the contents of the can from sight, but principally to protect the garbage element of the refuse from the sun.

The initials of the department will be stenciled on the outside of the hood. All cans are painted green and lettered upon the front, as shown in the illustration.
