
PATTERN MAKING ... 1890'S CORSET



FOLLOW THE GRID ABOVE AND TRANSFER THE PATTERN PIECES TO TRU-GRID PELLON OR 1" GRID PAPER. CAREFULLY FOLLOW MEASUREMENTS AND DRAW ALL DIRECTIONS ONTO THE PATTERN PIECES WITH A FELT PEN. IF A DIFFERENT SIZE CORSET IS DESIRED, SEE THE CHART ON PAGE ELEVEN.

CUT OUT PATTERN PIECES AND PIN TO COTTON CORSET FABRIC; THE IDEAL FABRIC IS COTTON COUTIL, A DRILL CLOTH, A SATIN BROCADE, OR CANVAS. THE CORSET WILL NOT BE LINED, THEREFORE TIGHTLY WOVEN COTTON FABRIC IS SUGGESTED.

PRE-SHRINK CANVAS AND DRILL CLOTH.




ARRANGE PATTERN PIECES CAREFULLY ON FOLDED FABRIC. PATTERN PIECES SHOULD BE PLACED WITH THE FABRIC GRAIN (AS SHOWN ABOVE). PIN AND CUT OUT. THE REMAINING FABRIC WILL BE USED TO CUT BIAS STRIPS TO FINISH TOP AND BOTTOM EDGE OF CORSET. USE A CHALK PENCIL AND IDENTIFY ALL CUT OUT PIECES ON THE WRONG SIDE OF THE FABRIC.


PIN CORSET PIECES TOGETHER WITH THE WRONG SIDES FACING. LEAVE THE CENTER FRONT AND CENTER BACK SEAMS OPEN. USING ½" SEAMS, MACHINE STITCH CORSET PIECES TOGETHER. THESE RAW SEAMS WILL BE FINISHED WITH RIBBON STAY COVERS. TRIM ALL SEAMS TO ½" AND PRESS.

ADD A SATIN RIBBON WAIST BAND TO INSIDE OF CORSET TO REDUCE STRAIN ON THE FABRIC AT WAIST LINE.


PIN 1 1/2" SATIN RIBBON IN POSITION AT EACH SEAM. AS RIBBON STAY COVERS ARE STITCHED IN PLACE THE RIBBON WAIST BAND WILL BE STITCHED ALSO.




CHOOSE A COMPLEMENTARY COLOR FOR THE RIBBON STAY COVERS AS THIS WILL ACCENTUATE THE WAIST LINE AND SHAPE OF THE CORSET. THE RIBBON WIDTH IS IMPORTANT AS IT MUST COVER THE METAL STAY AND ALLOW FOR MACHINE STITCHING ON BOTH SIDES (AS SHOWN




PLACE RIBBON OVER SEAM, PIN, AND SEW DOWN ONE SIDE AS CLOSE TO EDGE OF RIBBON AS THE OTHER EDGE. CONTINUE SEW POSSIBLE. THIS PROCEDURE UNTIL ALL SEAMS ARE COVERED. MARK WHERE CHALK PENCIL TO BE REMAINING STAY COVERS WILL SEWN. RIBBON STAY COVERS IN POSITION AND MACHINE STITCH.





ON THE GOOD SIDE OF FABRIC PIN FRONT FACING TO CENTER FRONT RIGHT SIDE. LAY CLASP I"DOWN FROM TOP OF CORSET. USE PENCIL TO MARK BOTH SIDES OF EACH CLASP. PIN AT EACH MARK. MACHINE STITCH BETWEEN STRAIGHT PINS. BACKSTITCH AT EACH STOPPING POINT, PRESS OPEN SEAM.






IN ORDER TO HIDE METAL CLASPS A BROCADE RIBBON CAN BE ADDED. STITCH RIBBON DOWN FRONT OF PRESSED OPEN SEAM AS SHOWN.






SLIDE FRONT CLASP INTO OPENINGS. USE ZIPPER FOOT TO STITCH THROUGH ALL FABRIC LAYERS NEXT TO CLASP.


PIN 2 1/2" WIDE FACING AND INTERFACING FABRIC AT BACK OPENING, MACHINE STITCH 1/2" SEAM, PRESS AND FOLD TO INSIDE OF PRESS AND PIN IN POSITION. CORSET BACK. Y2" SEW FIRST ROW OF STITCHES FROM IN LEAVE 1/2" SPACE FOR EYELETS OUTSIDE EDGE. AND STITCH A SECOND SEAM. SEW A FINAL ROW OF STITCHES AT OUTER EDGE OF FACING. FINISHED BACK CORSET SHOULD HAVE A CENTER AISLE FOR EYELETS ENCLOSED BY BONING ON EITHER SIDE.




FINISH THE TOP EDGE OF THE CORSET WITH BIAS TAPE IN THE SAME FABRIC. MACHINE STITCH BIAS TAPE TO TOP OUTSIDE EDGE OF CORSET. FOLD BIAS TAPE TO INSIDE AND MACHINE STITCH DOWN. SLIDE THE APPROPRIATE LENGTH METAL STAYS INTO THE RIBBON CASINGS. TACK STITCH 3/4" FROM BOTTOM EDGE OF CORSET.


FINISH THE BOTTOM EDGE OF CORSET WITH BIAS TAPE JUST AS THE TOP EDGE WAS COMPLETED.


LAY CORSET FLAT WITH BACK OPENING EVEN AND MARK WHERE ALL EYELETS WILL BE INSERTED.







USE A SMALL EYELET HOLE PUNCH TO CUT THROUGH ALL LAYERS. WORK ON TOP OF A DISPOSABLE PIECE OF WOOD. PRACTICE SETTING THE EYELETS FIRST BY USING SCRAP FABRIC. YOU WILL NEED A SMALL HAMMER AND A METAL EYELET SETTER. INSERT EYELETS FROM TOP SIDE OF FABRIC. FLIP CORSET OVER AND SET EYELETS FROM INSIDE. EYELETS SHOULD SPREAD AND CLAMP INTO FABRIC TIGHTLY.







ENCE, STAKT LACKED CORSET AT TOP AS SHOWN. PULL EXTRA LACE LENGTH OUT AT WAIST AREA. CONTINUE TO LACE TO BOTTOM OF CORSET. TIE BOW AND KNOT. USE WAIST LACES FOR ADJUSTMENTS. WRAP LACES AROUND WAIST ONCE THEN TIE IN BOW AT BACK.



FABRIC AND NOTIONS: (SIZE 12) 1 YD. FABRIC, 2½ YDS. ¼" SATIN RIBBON, 2½ YDS. INSERTION LACE, 1 YD. 1" BROCADE RIBBON, ½ YD. IRON-ON CANVAS INTERFACING, 12" METAL CENTER FRONT CLASP, 30 #2 METAL EYELETS, EYELET SETTER, HOLE PUNCH, 8 YD. SHOE LACE.

14" METAL STAYS : 6/ 12", 10/ 11", 4/ 10", 12/ 9", 2/ 8".




PATTERN MAKING · · · 1860'S CORSET

CUT TWO EACH OF THE PATTERN PIECES, PLUS TWO EACH FOR THE CORSET LINING.




TO ENLARGE AN EXISTING CORSET PATTERN TAKE CAREFUL MEASUREMENTS OF THE SUBJECT AND COMPARE THE MEASUREMENTS TO THE PATTERN PIECES. REMEMBER THAT THERE ARE 24 SEAM EDGES IN A 12 PIECE CORSET. IF YOU NEED AN EXTRA 3" IN THE UNDER-BUST AREA, THEN DIVIDE 3" BY 24. YOU WILL BE ADDING 1/8" TO EACH SEAM. IF 6" IS NEEDED IN THE HIP AREA, THEN DIVIDE 6" BY 24 AND ADD 1/4" TO EACH SEAM EDGE.




CUT TWO LAYERS OF OUTER FABRIC AND TWO LAYERS OF LINING FABRIC FOR PATTERN PIECES "A" THRU "F". PIN SEAMS TOGETHER AS INDICATED IN ILLUSTRATION AND MACHINE STITCH.



THE BEST FIT WILL COME FROM BASTING THE LINING TOGETHER FOR A FIRST FITTING. CUT THE LINING A LITTLE LARGER THAN YOU THINK YOU NEED. USE THE LONGEST STITCH ON THE SEWING MACHINE AND SEW ALL SEAMS TOGETHER INCLUDING THE FRONT CLOSURE.


REMEMBER THAT REDUCTION OF THE WAISTLINE IS THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE CORSET AND TAKE UP ACCORDINGLY.



FIT CORSET NOW. PIN OR BASTE THE CENTER FRONT SEAM. THE BACK SEAM OF THE CORSET SHOULD HAVE A GAP OF UP TO 2". THE CORSET LOOK SMOOTH SHOULD ON BODY. THE ADJUSTMENTS CAN BE EASILY MADE BY TAKING UP SEAMS IN LARGER CORSET SECTIONS.

AFTER ALL SEAMS HAVE BEEN TAKEN UP TO THE CORRECT SIZE AND MACHINED STITCHED, TRIM EACH SEAM TO THE REQUIRED 1/4 " SIZE. PRESS EACH SEAM IN SAME DIRECTION THE ACROSS THE WIDTH OF THE CORSET. CORSET OVER AND PRESS AGAIN, YOU ARE NOW READY TO APPLY THE RIBBON STAY COVERS.


HAVE A FRIEND HELP WITH THIS FITTING. THERE SHOULD BE A 2" GAP AT BACK OPENING FOR REDUCTION OF THE WAIST. START TAKING UP SEAMS A LITTLE AT A TIME UNTIL THE CORRECT FIT IS ACHIEVED. BE SURE TO TAKE THE SAME AMOUNT OUT OF THE MATCHING SEAM ON THE



WHEN FITTING IS COMPLETE ON BOTH THE OUTER FABRIC AND LINING, TRIM ALL SEAMS DOWN TO 1/4".

STEAM PRESS ALL SEAMS TOWARD BACK OPENING. ON THE FRONT SIDE OF CORSET REINFORCE SEAMS BY TOP STITCHING. FOLLOW THE SAME PROCEDURE WITH CORSET LINING.


PIN CORSET OUTER FABRIC TO CORSET LINING. LAY FRONT CLASP ON CORSET FRONT OPENING



AND MARK ON EACH SIDE OF CLASP HOOKS. ON THE OTHER SIDE OF FRONT OPENING INDICATE WHERE HOLES WILL BE CUT FOR INSERTION OF CLASP EYES. AT BACK OPENING STEAM PRESS IN


IRON-ON CANVAS TO STRENGTHEN

EYELET AREA.




MACHINE STITCH ACROSS TOP OF CORSET AND DOWN BACK STITCH FRONT SEAM AS INDICATED IN DRAWING. STITCH UP TO MARKS AND BACK STITCH TO LOCK THREAD. SKIP TO NEXT MARK AND DO THE SAME. THE METAL HOOKS OF THE CLASP SHOULD FRONT EASILY INTO THESE OPENINGS. TURN CORSET RIGHT SIDE OUT AND STEAM PRESS.

SLIDE FRONT CLASP HOOKS INTO DESIGNATED OPENINGS AND PIN IN POSITION. CHECK MARKS



FOR HOLES ON THE OTHER SIDE OF FRONT OPENING. USE AN ICE PICK OR NAIL TO PUNCH SMALL HOLES FOR CLASP EYES. INSERT CLASP EYES ONTO HOLES AND PIN CLASP FIRMLY AGAINST SEAM, USE A ZIPPER FOOT TO STITCH NEXT TO BOTH CLASP PIECES.


WITH A CHALK PENCIL MARK ON THE LINING WHERE ALL STAYS WILL BE INSERTED, DRAW A LINE ON EITHER SIDE OF THE STAY WHERE STITCHING WILL BE LOCATED, MACHINE STITCH AROUND EACH STAY POCKET LEAVING EACH POCKET BOTTOM OPEN. SLIDE METAL STAYS INTO EACH POCKET AND STITCH IT CLOSED AT BOTTOM,



SEW A 2" PIECE OF FACING DOWN EACH SIDE OF BACK OPENING. IRON-ON CANVAS [1½" WIDE] SHOULD ALREADY BE APPLIED DOWN THE BACK OPENING FOR EXTRA STRENGTH. TURN FACING UNDER, STEAM PRESS, PIN AND MACHINE STITCH. SEW A SEAM 3/8" FROM BACK EDGE TO CREATE THE POCKET FOR A METAL STAY. INSERT METAL STAYS IN POCKETS ON BOTH SIDES OF BACK OPENING.

SPACE EYELETS 11/4" APART AND MARK WHERE THEY WILL BE INSERTED. USE A HAMMER AND SMALL HOLE PUNCH TO CUT THROUGH ALL LAYERS. WORK ON A PIECE OF WOOD. PUSH EYELETS THROUGH FROM FRONT SIDE OF FABRIC. FLIP FABRIC OVER AND SET EYELETS WITH METAL SETTING TOOL AND HAMMER.

TURN A 1/2" SEAM TO THE INSIDE ALONG CORSET BOTTOM EDGE. PRESS, PIN, AND STITCH CLOSED. PIN LACE AND RIBBON TRIM ALONG LOWER EDGE OF CORSET AND STITCH IN POSITION.




PIN LACE AND RIBBON TRIM TO TOP EDGE OF CORSET. HAND STITCH IN POSITION. FOR EXTRA TRIM, ADD A SMALL BOW AT TOP CENTER AND BOTTOM OF FRONT CLOSURE.

FABRIC AND NOTIONS: (SIZE I2) I YD. FABRIC, I YD. LINING FABRIC, 2 ½ YDS. I" SATIN RIBBON, I½ YDS. INSERTION LACE, 1½ YDS. I NSERTION RIBBON, I YDS. I" EYELET LACE, ½ YD. IRON-ON CANVAS INTERFACING, I4" METAL CENTER FRONT CLASP, 30 #2 METAL EYELETS, EYELET SETTER, HOLE PUNCH, 8 YD. SHOE LACE.

SUGGESTED FABRICS: SATIN BROCADE, SILK, COTTON BROCADE, TAFFETA, COUTIL, SATIN RIBBON, MOIRE TAFFETA RIBBON, VELVET RIBBON, EYELET LACE, ANTIQUE LACE, CANVAS LINING, BRUSHED COTTON LINING.








USE TRU-GRID AND DUPLICATE THE PATTERN BELOW. MAKE YOUR SIZE ADJUSTMENTS NOW. THE BUST AREA SHOULD MEASURE 2 TO 4"



LARGER THAN YOUR OWN MEASUREMENTS. YOU CAN LENGTHEN OR SHORTEN THE CHEMISE AS DESIRED.


LAY THE TRU-GRID PATTERN PIECES ON YOUR FOLDED FABRIC. PLACE CHEMISE CENTER FRONT AND CENTER BACK ON THE FOLD, CUT OUT ALL THREE PIECES AND SOME 1 ½" BIAS TAPE STRIPS. SERGE TOGETHER SHOULDER SEAMS, GATHER TOP OF SLEEVE AND PIN INTO ARM EYE. SERGE IN PLACE, SERGE SLEEVE AND SIDE SEAM, ADD BIAS TAPE TO NECKLINE STARTING AT FRONT BELOW CENTER NECK, FINISH BIAS BY LEAVING

AN OPENING AT CENTER FRONT NECKLINE TO INSERT DRAWSTRING.




USE A SOFT BATISTE FABRIC FOR THE CHEMISE.
CUT IT LARGER SO THAT IT CAN BE DRAWN UP
AROUND THE NECKLINE. THE CHEMISE CAN BE
SLEEVELESS, HAVE A NARROW SHOULDER, HAVE
AMPLE LACE TRIM OR MADE PLAIN. THE CHEMISE
MAKES THE CORSET A LITTLE MORE
COMFORTABLE.

BEFORE SEWING SIDE SEAMS APPLY LACE TRIM.



CHOOSE A SOFT OLD FASHIONED LACE FOR CHEMISE TRIM. GATHER ALONG ONE EDGE AND PIN TO CHEMISE AS DESIRED. DO NOT RUN LACE INTO AREA WHERE CORSET WILL FIT. MACHINE STITCH LACE TRIM TO CHEMISE. TINY RIBBON TRIM IS A NICE COMPLEMENT.

ANTIQUE, HAND CROCHETED LACE CAN ADD A SPECIAL TOUCH TO THESE BATISTE OR SILK TOPS.



TINY PEARL BUTTONS CAN BE ADDED TO THE FRONT PLACKET.



FABRIC AND NOTIONS; 1½ YDS. BATISTE, 1-4 YDS. LACE, 42" DRAWSTRING, 1 YD. RIBBON.

SUGGESTED FABRICS: BATISTE, SILK, CHARMEUSE, SATIN CORD, ANTIQUE LACE, AND BUTTONS.





THESE SIZE 12 COPY DIMENSIONS FOR THE ONTO TRU-GRID FABRIC. ENLARGE THE EXTRA INCHES YOU NEED, EVENLY SEAMS. TRANSFER PATTERN TO SIDE HAVE CHOSEN. CUT OUT **FABRIC** YOU FRONTS AND TWO BACKS.

SEW CENTER FRONT SEAMS TOGETHER. SEW CENTER BACK SEAMS TOGETHER. PIN FRONT TO BACK DRAWERS AND STITCH SIDE SEAMS TOGETHER. PRESS ALL SEAMS OPEN. LINSEAM WILL BE LEFT OPEN FOR EASY APPLICATION OF TRIM, FOLD I" DOWN AT WAISTLINE FOR ELASTIC CASING. MACHINE STITCH CASING AND THREAD ELASTIC THROUGH. TIGHTEN AND TACK ELASTIC.




PIN ROWS OF EYELET OR LACE TRIM TO DRAWERS LEGS. SEW ALL TRIM IN POSITION. SEW INSEAM CLOSED.



FABRIC AND NOTIONS: 1½ YDS. FABRIC, 1½ YDS. 3" EYELET LACE, 3 YDS. 2" EYELET LACE, 1½ YDS. EYELET INSERTION LACE, 2 YDS. INSERTION RIBBON. 1 YD. ½" ELASTIC.

TRIM DESIGNS CAN BE AS ORNATE AS DESIRED. A FEW EXAMPLES ARE SHOWN.










CUT OUT TRU-GRID PATTERN PIECES. ARRANGE FRONT SIDE AND BACK PATTERN PIECES ON FOLDED FABRIC. PIN IN POSITION AND CUT OUT. CUT PEPLUM PIECES FROM REMAINING FABRIC. CUT MATCHING LININGS FOR ALL OF THESE PIECES. CUT SIDE, FRONT, AND BACK INTERFACINGS FROM IRON-ON CANVAS.




THESE QUANTITIES FOR METAL STAYS ARE APPROXIMATE AND MAY CHANGE AS THE CORSET IS FITTED AND TAKEN UP.

AN INEXPENSIVE PRODUCT THAT WORKS WELL AS BONING IS METAL STRAPPING USED ON CRATES AND IN SHIPPING. THIS PRODUCT MUST HAVE THE ENDS TIPPED WITH A PLASTIC SEALER SO IT WILL NOT CUT THROUGH THE FABRIC. SPRAY PAINTING THIS METAL STRAPPING WITH A NON-RUSTING PAINT IS SUGGESTED. THE ADVANTAGE OF THIS METAL BONING IS COST AND THE ABILITY TO CUT IT TO THE EXACT SIZE.





USE IRON-ON CANVAS INTERFACING TO STIFFEN THE ARMHOLES AND NECKLINE OF THE CORSET LINING. STEAM PRESS ALL INTERFACINGS IN POSITION. SEW LINING FRONT BODICE SEAM TO SIDE BODICE PIECE AND SIDE BODICE SEAM TO LINING BACK BODICE PIECE L AS SHOWN J. SEW OUTER FABRIC PIECES TO EACH OTHER IN THE SAME MANNER. LEAVE THE BACK SEAMS OPEN.




WITH PENCIL AND RULER DRAW STITCHING LINES **EVERY** FOR STAY POCKET ON LINING FABRIC. WORK ON THE TOPSIDE OF CORSET LINING FABRIC, PIN OUTER CORSET TO CORSET WITH LINING FACING UP MACHINE STITCH LINE TO PRODUCE POCKETS FOR STAYS. PENCIL TOP OF STAY POCKETS LEAVE OPEN FOR INSERTION OF STAYS. FINISH BOTTOM OF EACH STAY POCKET BY MACHINE STITCHING 3/4" ABOVE LOWFR CORSET EDGE.

CUT ALL PEPLUM PIECES,
PIN AND MACHINE STITCH
EACH PIECE OF PEPLUM TO
LINING, TURN AND PRESS,
NUMBER OF PEPLUM TABS
WILL BE GOVERNED BY
WAIST LENGTH,





CAREFULLY PIN TAB PIECES TO WAIST SEAM OF CORSET. VISUALLY CHECK TO BE SURE PEPLUM TABS HANG CORRECTLY WHEN VIEWED FROM THE FRONT. MACHINE STITCH PEPLUM TABS TO CORSET WAIST. FINISH THE WAIST SEAM BY SERGING OR COVER THE SEAM WITH BIAS TAPE.




FINISH THE BACK OPENING OF THE CORSET IN A SIMILAR MANNER AS THE VICTORIAN CORSET. SEW A BACK FACING DOWN BOTH SIDES OF BACK OPENING. FOLD IN, PRESS, AND WHIP STITCH FACING TO FINISH BACK SEAMS. MARK WHERE EYELETS (SMALL GROMMETS) WILL BE PLACED, EYELETS SHOULD BE PLACED IN AISLE BETWEEN TWO BACK PIECES OF BONING. FOLLOW DIRECTIONS FOR SETTING EYELETS ON PRECEDING PAGES. USE A 54" SHOE LACE TO FASTEN CORSET.

FABRIC AND NOTIONS: I YD, FABRIC, I YD, LINING, I 'Z YDS, RIBBON, I YD. IRON-ON CANVAS, 20 SMALL GROMMETS, HOLE PUNCH, GROMMET SETTER, 54" SHOE LACE.

METAL STAYS : (SIZE 12) 2/6", 12/8", 4/10", 18/12", 8/10.


THESE QUANTITIES FOR METAL STAYS ARE APPROXIMATE AND MAY CHANGE AS THE CORSET IS FITTED AND TAKEN UP.

SUGGESTED FABRICS: EMBROIDERIED CREWEL, TAPESTRY WEAVE, HEAVY BROCADE, WOOL, VELVET, SATIN. LINING FABRIC- MUSLIN, CANVAS, SATIN, COTTON.











TRANSFER THE THE GRID ABOVE AND FOLLOW PATTERN PIECES TO TRU-GRID PELLON OR 1" GRID CAREFULLY FOLLOW MEASUREMENTS AND PAPER. PATTERN ALL DIRECTIONS ONTO THE DRAW DIFFERENT SIZE PIECES WITH A FELT PEN. IF A DESIRED, SEE THE CHART AT THE CORSET IS BACK OF THIS BOOK.

CUT TWO EACH OF THE CORSELET FRONT, BACK AND STRAPS. DO THE SAME WITH THE LINING FABRIC. USE IRON-ON CANVAS TO CUT FOUR FRONT INTERFACINGS. WITH THE RIGHT SIDES OF FABRIC TOGETHER SEW THE BACK SEAM. SEW SIDE SEAMS. PUT THE LINING PIECES TOGETHER IN THE SAME WAY.




PRESS CANVAS INTERFACING TO LINING AT CENTER FRONT OPENING.




BONING WILL BE APPLIED ONLY TO CORSET LINING. USE A CHALK PENCIL TO INDICATE WHERE BONING WILL BE SEWN TO LINING. FEATHER WEIGHT BONING MAY BE USED INSTEAD OF METAL BONING. CUT BONING TO SIZE AND STEAM PRESS FLAT. PIN IN POSITION LEAVING A 3/4" SEAM AT THE TOP AND BOTTOM OF CORSELET. USE MACHINE TO STITCH DIRECTLY DOWN CENTER OF EACH PIECE OF BONING. AFTER ALL BONING IS APPLIED, STEAM PRESS CORSET LINING.




SEAM ALLOWANCE ON OUTSIDE EDGES. MACHINE STITCH ALL TRIM IN POSITION. PIN RIGHT SIDES OF CORSELET TOGETHER AND SEW TOP, BOTTOM AND ONE FRONT SEAM. LEAVE THE OTHER SEAM OPEN FOR TURNING THE GARMENT. TURN RIGHT SIDE OUT AND PRESS.




AFTER SEWING FRONT CORSET TO LINING, TURN AND PRESS ON WRONG SIDE. FOLD OPEN SEAM TO THE INSIDE AND HAND STITCH CLOSED. MARK WHERE GROMMETS WILL BE PLACED. CHOOSE A LARGE HOLE PUNCH THAT WILL ACCOMMODATE THIS SIZE GROMMET. AS SUGGESTED BEFORE, WORK ON A DIECE OF WOOD.




PUSH GROMMETS INTO HOLES FROM FRONT SIDE OF FABRIC. FLIP CORSELET OVER AND POSITION SECOND PART OF GROMMET INTO PLACE. USE A HAMMER AND A SETTING TOOL TO JOIN GROMMET PIECES TOGETHER TIGHTLY THROUGH FABRIC.









AFTER SEWING FRONT CORSET TO LINING, TURN AND PRESS ON WRONG SIDE. FOLD OPEN SEAM TO THE INSIDE AND HAND STITCH CLOSED. MARK WHERE GROMMETS WILL BE PLACED. CHOOSE A LARGE HOLE PUNCH THAT WILL ACCOMMODATE THIS SIZE GROMMET. AS SUGGESTED BEFORE,



PUSH GROMMETS INTO HOLES FROM FRONT SIDE OF FABRIC, FLIP CORSELET OVER AND POSITION SECOND PART OF GROMMET INTO PLACE, USE A HAMMER AND A SETTING TOOL TO JOIN GROMMET PIECES TOGETHER TIGHTLY THROUGH FABRIC.




MAKE CORSELET STRAPS BY PINNING FABRIC AND LINING TOGETHER. STITCH UP ONE SIDE AND DOWN THE OTHER LEAVING THE BOTTOM OF STRAP OPEN FOR TURNING. TURN AND PRESS.




ADD TRIM. SERGE BOTTOM EDGE OF STRAP.

FIT CORSELET TO WEARER AND PIN STRAPS IN PROPER POSITION. MACHINE STITCH STRAPS TO CORSELET.




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HERE ARE JUST A FEW OF THE DIFFERENT STYLES THAT CAN BE ACHIEVED WITH THE ADDITION OF TRIMS,



ENLARGE CORSELET AT BACK AND SIDE SEAMS.
THE ADDITION OF 1/4" TO THESE SEAM EDGES WILL
INCREASE THE PATTERN ONE SIZE.



ADDITIONAL BONING WILL BE NECCESSARY AS THE CORSELET SIZE INCREASES.

FABRIC AND NOTIONS: 3/4 YD. FABRIC, 3/4 YD. LINING FABRIC, 1/4 YD. I RON-ON CANVAS, 5 YDS. PLASTIC BONING, 8 YDS. TRIM, 10 SMALL GROMMETS, HOLE PUNCH, GROMMET SETTER, 36" SHOE LACE OR LEATHER THONG.


FABRIC SUGGESTIONS: HEAVY WOVEN FABRICS WITH A DESIGN, PETTIPOINT UPHOLSTERY FABRIC, BROGADES, TRAPUNTO, CREWEL WORK, SUEDE, VELVET.

TRIM SUGGESTIONS: METALLIC BRAID, LACE, RIBBON, TASSELS, BUTTONS, APPLIQUES, BOLO TIPS, FLOWERS.

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
