Dance used to draw Valuable objects
into village. Nomen line up behind
men, hands on hims - progress backward,
away from camera, in short, jumping

Sidomang Radjambip of Kolana (east)

Walgations (kolana lang.)
Drawing valuable objects
into village. Men progress
with small side hops, both
feet simultaneously off
ground. Women place hands

Waisika Radjaship of Kolana( west)

Koede ( in Kolana Lang.) Dance used to draw valuable objects into Village. Equivalent of "Dokak" in Aboei. Is essentially a challenge to follow.






Sacemasi Radjaship of Kolana (east)

Atimelong Radjaship of Alor

Dodak (or dodaike, dokati.) This is challenge dance between two men. Used afterdawn to end an all night lego-lego. This is considered same dance as that used to draw valuable objects into village


















Atimelang Radjaship of Alor (west)

Takes we: Not a dance, but the formalized postures of debate. This is ceremonial anger at time of delivery of a bride-price payment (kajock). One woman represents wife's family, one the husband's.







Solo dancer of rongge (Malay) type. Coastal; not in mountains except as recent and occasional importation.







Nauman Radjaship of Kolana (east)

Solo dancer who did a sort of rongge. This face painting considered a recent importation from area of Timor Dilly. Only seen in this general area (but may have wider distribution) Only a few individuals go in for this face painting when a doing a rongge.
Note: Moustache of goat hair Pigment white, black and red.



Sidomans Radjaship of Kolana

Imported dance from coast. Rongge (Malay). Here the soloist is performing in front of dancers drawing valuable objects into village. This is probably modern importation and incorporation of two disparate dances.

Kalabahi Badjaship of Alor

Impromptu headdress for dance or 'dress' occasion, used only on coast







Taramana Radjaship of Kolana

Gongs and skin drums. This sort of instrumental accompaniment occurs only with dance to draw valuable objects into village. Mokos also used in addition to gongs, Skin drum used nor more rarely.












